- ◆ Making a movable soldier which looked just like one of the Queen's guards.

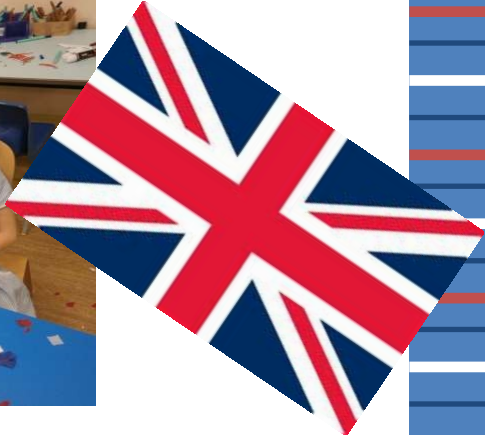
## Key stage 1
