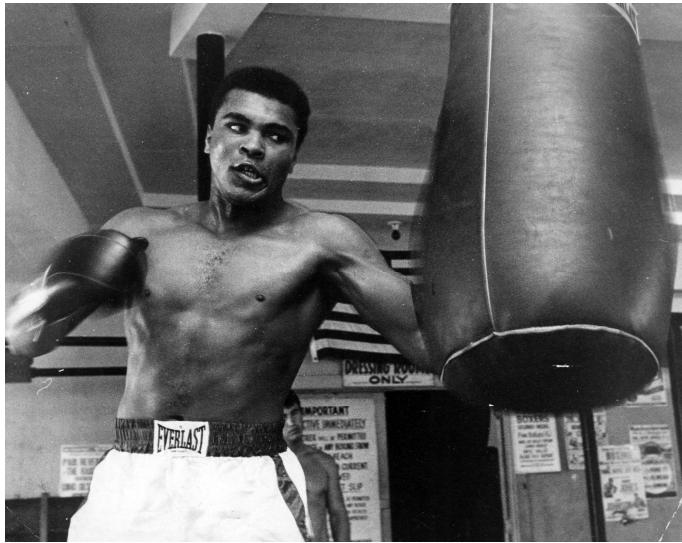

World's GREATEST sport star dies Muhammad Ali (1942–2016)

On Saturday 4th June, one of the greatest athletes who ever lived sadly passed away aged 74.

Muhammad Ali was world heavy weight champion boxer of the world on three different occasions.

Unfortunately, in the 1980s he was diagnosed with a disease that affects the brain called Parkinson's disease. This disease slowly makes your brain forget things and you may end up having trouble controlling your muscles in your legs and arms.



Although having this disease, (Muhammad Ali had some difficulty in his movement) it never stopped him in other aspects of his life.

Who was Muhammad Ali?

He was born in Kentucky, USA in 1942, and went to represent the USA in the 1960s Olympics in Rome, where he won a gold medal. He soon decided to convert (change) religion from Christianity to Islam and became a Muslim. His original Christian name was Cassius Clay, which he decided to change to Muhammad Ali. In 1964 he beat boxer, Sonny Liston, to become World Heavyweight Champion of the world for the first time.

Why was he so famous?

Not only was he a great boxer, but he brought his own humour to the sport. Ali had many sayings and most of them are still used and heard today. One of his most famous sayings is "Float like a butterfly, sting like a bee." Not only was Ali a great boxer, but he brought the world's attention to the racism that was still seen in America at the time. Ali felt that people of ALL races, colours and religions should be treated the same. Unfortunately, at the time in America, black people had to sit separately from white people on the bus, in cinemas and couldn't go to all the same places that white people could. Ali went on to fight for the rights of all different people of race, colour and religion and during the 1960s, when Ali was at his most famous as a boxer, laws started to change in America allowing ALL people regardless of race or religion to have the same rights as others.

How Muhammad Ali wanted to be remembered

Ali said, "As a man who won the heavyweight title three times, who was humorous and who treated everyone they met the same... A man who tried to bring everyone together through faith and love."
